It is people like Peter that are truly the backbone of our organization. If his commitment to the newsletter and his term as President weren't enough to keep him busy this past year he also spearheaded the APC website with Dr. Chris Wyatt's help.

Thanks to Dr. Saba's ongoing work with the Journal of the Canadian Dental Association, APC jointly published another very successful issue of the JCDA in October. This joint APC/JCDA issue provides our specialty a fabulous opportunity to showcase our diagnostic, technical, and clinical abilities to the dental profession as a whole. The financial health of the APC in the coming decade is of special interest to me and, of course, you. My first two years on the executive council was served as Secretary-Treasurer. This exposure led me to be concerned about the financial viability of our association considering the numerous annual deficits over the past ten years. Although APC demonstrated large income earnings during certain years in this past decade, these earnings were mainly a result of very hard work by one or a few individuals and was always offset with large expenses. Considering the small membership numbers in our association, this large but unpredictable income and expense pattern represented a level of financial instability that could no longer be supported. Changes in the focus of recent Executive Councils have reduced this volatile financial pattern and returned APC to a lower income but lower expense position, more reflective of the size of our association. This return to financial stability now allows our executive to focus on serving our membership without distraction.

Over the past few months the APC Executive Council has been assisting The Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada (CDAC) with drafting a new set of Accreditation Requirements for Canadian Prosthodontic Programs. The CDAC functions at arms-length from the CDA to provide accreditation of dental programs and institutions in Canada. This document serves to communicate all the requirements for accreditation of Canadian Prosthodontic programs, which is an element of the requirement for specialty licensure. An APC "ad hoc Committee on Accreditation requirements for Prosthodontic Programs" was struck to advise the APC executive council and facilitate input to the CDAC on behalf of the APC. This activity serves as only one isolated example of how your association represents its membership and specialty in Canada.

Our Annual General Meeting for 2002 will be held in conjunction with the American College of Prosthodontists annual session in Orlando. Mark your calendars for November 6-9, 2002, as this meeting promises to be a good one.

My intention is to serve our association and represent its members to the best of my ability over the coming year. To help me achieve this goal I invite the membership to contact me to discuss any matters that may arise throughout my term as President.

Labour Mobility Update

The consultation and negotiation work on the Labour Mobility front for our Canadian Dental Regulatory Authorities (DRAs) wound up with the August 29-30, 2001 with the CDA-facilitated meeting of the DRAs and Government representatives at the RCDSO offices in Toronto. The Specialists Mutual Recognition Agreement was finalized at this key meeting; the Agreement section of this finalized document, as provided by the CDA, is as follows:

Subject to the terms of this MRA, we, the undersigned, hereby agree as follows:

- a) For the purpose of labour mobility, to recognize without further competency examination, an Applicant who holds Non-Restricted Specialty Licensure prior to July 1, 2001 with a DRA regardless of the criteria used by that DRA to grant that Specialty Licensure and
 - i) Applicants with Non-Restricted Specialty Licensure obtained prior to July 1, 2001 who do not hold an NDEB certificate, will be recognized as holding a qualification equivalent to the NDEB certificate for the purposes of labour mobility;
 - ii) Applicants with Non-Restricted Specialty Licensure obtained prior to July 1, 2001 shall be considered to have successfully completed a Specialty Examination for the purposes of labour mobility.
- b) The
 - i) holding of an NDEB certificate;
 - ii) graduation from a Dental Specialty educa-

tional program accredited by CDAC or accredited under the terms of a reciprocal agreement approved by CDAC and the DRA's, and

- iii) successful completion of the Specialty Examination, shall be non-exemptible requirements for mobility of Applicants whose initial Non-Restricted Specialty Licensure occurs on or after July 1, 2001.
- c) An Applicant may be required to meet other requirements as a condition of Specialty Licensure. These requirements may include (but are not limited to) the following:
 - i) Satisfying the receiving DRA that there is no evidence of ineligibility or inability to meet the receiving DRA's requirements for Good Standing or professional conduct;
 - ii) Satisfying the receiving DRA that he/she has complied with the continuing competency/quality assurance requirements of the DRA(s) with which he/she currently holds Specialty Licensure;
 - iii) Satisfying the receiving DRA that there is no evidence of ineligibility or inability to meet the receiving DRA's requirements for continuing competency/quality assurance;
 - iv) Payment of fees;
 - v) Successful completion of a course(s) and/or examination(s) dealing with ethics and jurisprudence;
 - vi) Satisfying the receiving DRA that the Applicant's past and present conduct affords

reasonable grounds for the belief that the Applicant:

- I) is mentally competent and physically able to safely practise dentistry;
 - II) will practise dentistry with decency, integrity and honesty and in accordance with the law;
 - III) has sufficient knowledge, skill and judgement to competently engage in dental practice authorized by the Specialty License for which he/she is applying; and
 - IV) can communicate effectively and will display an appropriate professional attitude.
- vii) Satisfying the language requirements of the receiving DRA.

The status of this MRA, as of February 1, 2002 and as advised by CDA, with respect to signature by each of the DRA jurisdictions is as follows:

SK, MB, ON, NB, NS & PE: signed.

NF: has been forwarded the document for signature.

PQ: expects to sign as soon as the English version is translated and the resultant French version is accepted.

BC: further internal discussions are currently taking place.

AB: will not be signing.

Please contact your respective DRAs for any further information regarding Specialist MRA signature status or implementation dates in the various jurisdictions.

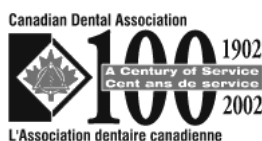

CDA Board of Governors 2001 Annual Meeting

The 2001 Annual Meeting of the CDA Board of Governors (BoG) was held November 16-17, 2001 at the Westin Hotel in Ottawa; in attendance on behalf of APC was James Taylor (APC CDA Rep). Along with the performing the customary role of closely monitoring the proceedings of this important meeting of our national Dental association, APC brought forward USC&LS amendments, as proposed by our Regional/Provincial Prosthodontist organizations and reviewed, prepared and submitted by the APC USC&LS Committee Chair, Henry Levant. During the course of the meeting, the CDA Editor, John O'Keefe, officially congratulated the APC once again on the continuing success of the CDA/APC joint publication initiative as reflected in the October 2001 JCDA/JADC.

This meeting also saw significant leaps forward in the structural inclusion of APC and the other eight National Dental Specialty Organizations (NDSOs) in the decision-making process of the CDA. Firstly, the Committee on Specialist Affairs (COSA) was re-activated as a Committee of CDA Executive Council. COSA comprises one representative appointed by each of the nine NDSOs, plus two persons acting as CDA Executive Council liaison appointed by the CDA President. The duties of COSA, as expressed in the Committee's Terms of Reference, are as follows:

- (1) To represent the concerns and issues of dental specialists and to advise on issues related to the practice of dentistry and the practice of the respective dental specialties;
- (2) To develop related positions, resources and recommendations and to report at least annually;
- (3) To support the CDA and its provincial corporate members in actualizing the CDA mission statement and achieving its goals and key result areas.
- (4) To foster and encourage communication, a

sense of community and a spirit of collaboration between dentists and dental specialists and between and among the National Specialty Organizations and their respective memberships;

- (5) To deal with any issues or matters that may be assigned for action or advice.

The APC Executive Council appointed James Taylor to an initial three-year term as our COSA Rep.

A second major step was related to the CDA's new governance framework moving from a political model of decision-making to one built upon the knowledge-based decision-making philosophy, which is in line with CDA's strategic plan. This was reflected in the BoG approval of the new governance structure, which involves two of the 25 Voting members of the CDA General Assembly representatives being from the CDA Specialty Sections (namely NDSOs), as well as there being a non-voting seat for each of the Specialty Sections (namely NDSOs). This represents a major enfranchisement of Dental Specialists in Canada, and the CDA is to be congratulated on its forward-looking decision in this regard.

"JT" and his spouse, Elizabeth, also attended the President's Gala, which saw the installation of the 2001/2002 CDA President, George Sweetnam. This opportunity was taken to congratulate George on his accession to office, and express the continued support of the APC for our national Dental association, from whom we derive our mandate as the organization representing the specialists and specialty of Prosthodontics in Canada.

The next CDA BoG meeting, namely the 2002 Interim meeting, will be held at the same venue March 15-16; James Taylor will be presenting the APC Annual Report at this meeting in accordance with CDA Bylaws on behalf of our President, Don Reikie.

It gives me great pleasure to report, on behalf of the Nominating Committee, that during our October 19, 2001 Annual General Meeting in Montréal, Dr. Derek W. Jones was voted to Honorary Membership of the Association of Prosthodontists of Canada in accordance with Article VI of the Bylaws.

Dr. Jones is a Professor Emeritus of Biomaterials at the Dalhousie University Faculty of Dentistry. He has also served as the Head of the Division of Biomaterials Science, the Chair of the Department of Applied Oral Sciences and the Assistant Dean for Research, while holding cross-appointments in Medicine, Pharmacy and Engineering. His research, as Prosthodontists will recall from the literature, has been conducted on a wide range of biomaterials and material properties covering ceramics, refractories, hard and soft polymers, composites, dental cements, bone cements, mercury pollution, biocompatibility of materials, synthesis of glass and polymer materials, and the release of drugs from biomaterials

Among his numerous accomplishments over several decades, Dr. Jones is currently the Chair of the CSA Technical Committee on Dentistry, the Chair of the Canadian Advisory Committee to ISO, the Chair of the ISO Committee on Restorative Materials, the President of the Dental Materials Group Chapter CADR/ IADR, a Member of the NIH Advisory panel, and a confidential advisor and consultant to Health Canada. He is also a Past President of the IADR International Dental Materials Group and a Past President of the CADR, and has been a recipient of the IADR Wilmer Souder Distinguished Scientist Award and of the CDA Distinguished Service Award.
